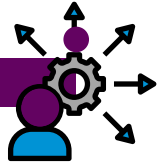


TOP TIPS FOR TEACHING WITH SAGE knowledge

SUPPORT LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Different content types can serve different outcomes. “Dictionaries” can provide students a quick refresher on terms and concepts covered in class. “Encyclopedias” written in authoritative and accessible language are perfect places for students to begin their research and learning journey. Professional development titles can offer practical support for real-world growth.



HIGHLIGHT IN SYLLABI

INTEGRATE INTO COURSES

Embed or link directly to content in your LMS and syllabus to give students immediate and easy access to specific content. Other ideas to incorporate SK into your instruction include:

- Ask your students to find content related to a particular topic, create their own reading list to use as the basis for an annotated bibliography.
- Assign an SK entry for students to read, then post 1-3 discussion questions on your learning management system and require students to respond.
- Reading lists can be powerful tools to develop curated groups of resources – ensuring everyone is starting from the same place. Some specific ways to integrate SK reading lists are:
 - Place links to resources (books, handbooks, debates, etc.) directly in your learning management system for easy viewing. DOI links are available at the book and chapter level to get students to the content they need quickly. Create a ‘Suggested Reading’ collection on your syllabus, containing content that re-explains material covered in the course that students can access to reinforce classroom and textbook learning, or as test preparation.
 - Build a Glossary of terms used in your course using “Dictionary” entries.
 - Create a reading list of “how-to” resources for dissertations and theses, from across disciplines, and post to your LMS as a quick reference.
 - Interested in new teaching techniques and strategies? Create a reading list of professional development titles to help you brush up on ways to improve student learning outcomes.



AID STUDENTS WITH RESEARCH TOOLS

- Cite: SK citation data exports to common citation managers to help in building bibliographies.
- Encourage students to go to the platform and benefit from the Related Content, keywords, and connections to other relevant resources.
